When is anger justified?

Anger is justified when God is deliberately disobeyed

Exodus 32:19-20

Jealousy can do the same to us when someone receives something we feel we deserve


Recognize the source of our anger and ask God for help

Anger is unjustified when we didn't get our way, or when things didn't turn out as we planned

Ignore petty disagreements
